ERASMUS+ ALBUFERA

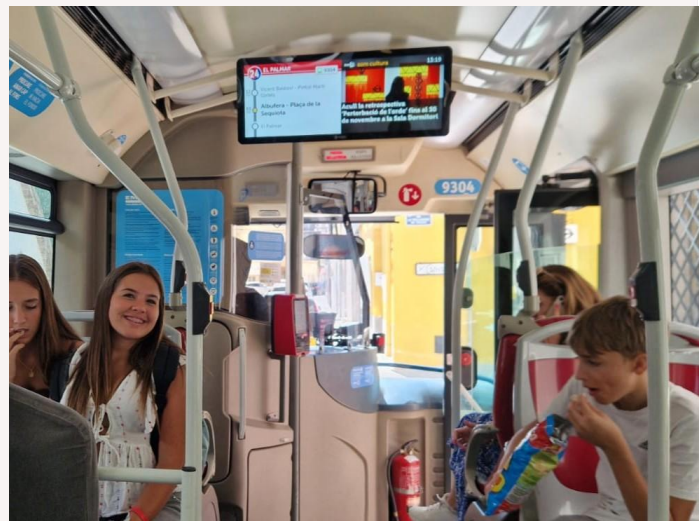

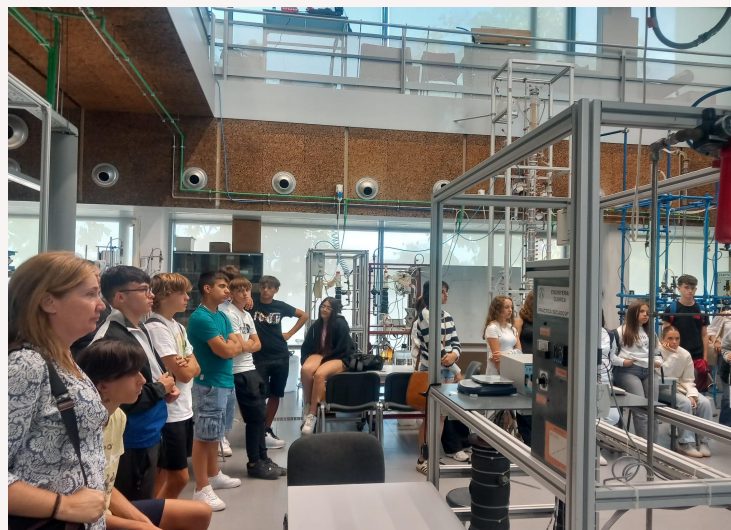
EXPLORING INNOVATION AT THE UNIVERSITY
